- A (1-3) Now the serpent was more subtil than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said unto the woman, Yea, hath God said, Ye shall not eat of every **tree** of the **garden?** And the woman said unto the serpent, We may eat of the fruit of the **trees** of the **garden:** But of the fruit of **the tree which is in the midst of the garden**, God hath said, Ye shall not eat of it, neither shall ye touch it, lest ye die.
- B (4-6) And the serpent said unto the woman, Ye shall not surely die: For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil. And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took of the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat.
- C (7) And the eyes of them both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together, and made themselves aprons.
- D (8) And they heard the voice of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day: and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God amongst the trees of the garden.

- E (9-12) And the LORD God called unto Adam, and said unto him, Where art thou? And he said, I heard thy voice in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked; and I hid myself. And he said, Who told thee that thou wast naked? Hast thou eaten of the tree, whereof I commanded thee that thou shouldest not eat? And the man said, The woman whom thou gavest to be with me, she gave me of the tree, and I did eat.
- F (13) And the LORD God said unto the woman, What is this that thou hast done? And the woman said, The serpent beguiled me, and I did eat.
- G (14-15) And the LORD God said unto the serpent, Because thou hast done this, thou art cursed above all cattle, and above every beast of the field; upon thy belly shalt thou go, and dust shalt thou eat all the days of thy life: **And I** will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel.
- F' (16) **Unto the woman he said**, I will greatly multiply thy sorrow and thy conception; in sorrow thou shalt bring forth children; and thy desire shall be to thy husband, and he shall rule over thee.
- E' (17-19) And unto Adam he said, Because thou hast hearkened unto the voice of thy wife, and hast eaten of the tree, of which I commanded thee, saying, Thou shalt not eat of it: cursed is the ground for thy sake; in sorrow shalt thou eat of it all the days of thy life; Thorns also and thistles shall it bring forth to thee; and thou shalt eat the herb of the field; In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it wast thou taken: for dust thou art, and unto dust shalt thou return.
- D' (20) And Adam called his wife's name Eve; because she was the mother of all living.
- C' (21) Unto Adam also and to his wife did the LORD God make coats of skins, and clothed them.
- B' (22) And the LORD God said, Behold, the man is become as one of us, to know good and evil: and now, lest he put forth his hand, and take also of the tree of life, and eat, and live for ever:
- A' (23-24) Therefore the LORD God sent him forth from the **garden** of Eden, to till the ground from whence he was taken. So he drove out the man; and he placed at the east of the **garden** of Eden Cherubims, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to keep the way of **the tree of life**.

- C (8b) unto a land flowing with milk and honey;
- D (8c) unto the place of the Canaanites, and the Hittites, and the Amorites, and the Perizzites, and the Hivites, and the Jebusites.

E (9-12) Now therefore, behold, the cry of the children of Israel is come unto me: and I have also seen the oppression wherewith the Egyptians oppress them. Come now therefore, and I will send thee unto Pharaoh, that thou mayest bring forth my people the children of Israel out of Egypt. And Moses said unto God, Who am I, that I should go unto Pharaoh, and that I should bring forth the children of Israel out of Egypt? And he said, Certainly I will be with thee; and this shall be a token unto thee, that I have sent thee: When thou hast brought forth the people out of Egypt, ye shall serve God upon this mountain.

- G (13b) What is his name?
- H (13c) what shall I say unto them?
- I (14a) And God said unto Moses,
- J (14b) I AM THAT I AM: (I will be who I will be)
- I' (14c) and he said,
- H' (14d) Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel,
- G' (14c) I AM (I will be) hath sent me unto you.
- F' (15) And God said moreover unto Moses, Thus shalt thou say unto the children of Israel, **The LORD God of your fathers**, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, **hath sent me unto you:** this is my name for ever, and this is my memorial unto all generations.
- E' (16-17a) Go, and gather the elders of Israel together, and say unto them, The LORD God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, of Isaac, and of Jacob, appeared unto me, saying, I have surely visited you, and seen that which is done to you in Egypt: And I have said, I will bring you up out of the affliction of Egypt

- B' (18-22) And they shall hearken to thy voice: and thou shalt come, thou and the elders of Israel, unto the king of Egypt, and ye shall say unto him, The LORD God of the Hebrews hath met with us: and now let us go, we beseech thee, three days' journey into the wilderness, that we may sacrifice to the LORD our God. And I am sure that the king of Egypt will not let you go, no, not by a mighty hand. And I will stretch out my hand, and smite Egypt with all my wonders which I will do in the midst thereof: and after that he will let you go. And I will give this people favour in the sight of the Egyptians: and

it shall come to pass, that, when ye go, ye shall not go empty: But every woman shall borrow of her neighbour, and of her that sojourneth in her house, jewels of silver, and jewels of gold, and raiment: and ye shall put them upon your sons, and upon your daughters; and ye shall spoil the Egyptians.

A' (4:1-5) And Moses answered and said, But, behold, they will not believe me, nor hearken unto my voice: for they will say, The LORD hath not appeared unto thee. And the LORD said unto him, What is that in thine hand? And he said, A rod. And he said, Cast it on the ground. And he cast it on the ground, and it became a serpent; and Moses fled from before it. A (15a) Seven days shall ye eat unleavened bread;

B (15b) even the first day ye shall **put away leaven out of your houses:** for whosoever eateth leavened bread from the first day until the seventh day, **that soul shall be cut off** from Israel.

C (16) And in the **first day** there shall be an holy convocation, and in **the seventh day** there shall be an holy convocation to you; no manner of work shall be done in them, save that which every man must eat, that only may be done of you.

D (17a) And ye shall observe the feast of unleavened bread;

E (17b) for in this selfsame day have I brought your armies out of the land of Egypt:

D' (17c) therefore shall ye **observe** this day in your generations by an ordinance for ever.

C' (18) In the first month, on **the fourteenth day** of the month at even, ye shall eat unleavened bread, until **the one and twentieth day** of the month at even.

B' (19-20a) Seven days shall there be **no leaven found in your houses:** for whosoever eateth that which is leavened, even **that soul shall be cut off** from the congregation of Israel, whether he be a stranger, or born in the land. Ye shall eat nothing leavened;

A' (20b) in all your habitations shall ye eat unleavened bread.

Exod 12:40-51

A (40-41) Now the sojourning of the children of Israel, who dwelt in Egypt, was four hundred and thirty years. And it came to pass at the end of the four hundred and thirty years, even the **selfsame day** it came to pass, that all the hosts of the LORD went out from the land of Egypt.

B (42) It is a night to be much observed unto the LORD for bringing them out from the land of Egypt: this is that night of the LORD to be observed of all the children of Israel in their generations.

C (43) And the LORD said unto Moses and Aaron, This is the **ordinance** of the passover: There shall no stranger eat thereof:

D (44) But every man's servant that is bought for money, when thou hast **circumcised** him, then shall he eat thereof.

E (45) A foreigner and an hired servant shall not eat thereof.

F (46a) In one house shall it be eaten;

G (46b) thou shalt not carry forth ought of the flesh abroad out of the house; neither shall ye break a bone thereof.

- D' (48b) let all his males be **circumcised**, and then let him come near and keep it; and he shall be as one that is born in the land:
- C' (48c-49) for no uncircumcised person shall eat thereof. One law shall be to him that is homeborn, and unto the stranger that sojourneth among you.
- B' (50) Thus did all the children of Israel; as the LORD commanded Moses and Aaron, so did they.
- A' (51) And it came to pass the **selfsame day**, that the LORD did bring the children of Israel out of the land of Egypt by their armies.

- A (5) There shall not any man be able to stand before thee all the days of thy life: as I was with Moses, so I will be with thee: I will not fail thee, nor forsake thee.

D (22b) the bow of Jonathan turned not back,

D' (22c) and the sword of Saul returned not empty.

C' (23) Saul and Jonathan were lovely and pleasant in their lives, and in their death they were not divided: they were swifter than eagles, they were stronger than lions.

B' (24) Ye daughters of Israel, weep over Saul, who clothed you in scarlet, with other delights, who put on ornaments of gold upon your apparel.

A' (25-27) **How are the mighty fallen** in the midst of the battle! O Jonathan, thou wast **slain** in thine **high places**. I am distressed for thee, my brother Jonathan: very pleasant hast thou been unto me: thy love to me was wonderful, passing the love of women. **How are the mighty fallen**, and the weapons of war perished!

- D (1d-2) and when she was come to Solomon, she communed with him of all that was in her heart. And Solomon told her all her questions: and there was nothing hid from Solomon which he told her not.
- E (3a) And when the gueen of Sheba had seen the wisdom of Solomon,

- E' (7b) and hear thy wisdom.
- D' (8) Blessed be the LORD thy God, which delighted in thee to set thee on his throne, to be king for the LORD thy God: because thy God loved Israel, to establish them for ever, therefore made he thee king over them, to do judgment and justice.
- C' (9-10) And she gave the king an hundred and twenty talents of **gold**, and of **spices** great abundance, and **precious stones**: neither was there any such **spice** as the queen of Sheba gave king Solomon. And the servants also of Huram, and the servants of Solomon, which brought **gold** from Ophir, brought algum trees and **precious stones**.

- A (1:1-2) The words of Nehemiah the son of Hachaliah. And it came to pass in the month Chisleu, in the twentieth year, as I was in Shushan the palace, That Hanani, one of my brethren, came, he and certain men of Judah; and I asked them concerning the Jews that had escaped, which were left of the captivity, and concerning **Jerusalem**.
- B (3) And they said unto me, The remnant that are left of the captivity there in the province are in great affliction and reproach: the wall of Jerusalem also is broken down, and the gates thereof are burned with fire.
- C (4) And it came to pass, when I heard these words, that I sat down and wept, and mourned certain days, and fasted, and prayed before the God of heaven,
- D (5) And said, I beseech thee, O LORD God of heaven, the great and terrible God, that keepeth covenant and mercy for them that love him and observe his commandments:
- E (6a) Let thine ear now be attentive, and thine eyes open, that thou mayest hear the prayer of thy servant,
- F (6b) which I pray before thee now, day and night, for the **children of Israel thy servants**,

- G (6c-7) and confess the sins of the children of Israel, which we have sinned against thee: both I and my father's house have sinned. We have dealt very corruptly against thee, and have not **kept the commandments**, nor the statutes, nor the judgments,
- H (7b) which thou commandedst thy servant Moses.
- I (8) Remember, I beseech thee, the word
- H' (8b) that thou commandedst thy servant Moses,
- G' (8c-9) saying, If ye transgress, I will scatter you abroad among the nations: But if ye turn unto me, and **keep my commandments**, and do them; though there were of you cast out unto the uttermost part of the heaven, yet will I gather them from thence, and will bring them unto the place that I have chosen to set my name there.
- F' (10) Now these are **thy servants and thy people**, whom thou hast redeemed by thy great power, and by thy strong hand.
- E' (11a) O Lord, I beseech thee, let now thine ear be attentive to the prayer of thy servant, and to the prayer of thy servants, who desire to fear thy name:
- D' (11b) and prosper, I pray thee, thy servant this day, and grant him mercy in the sight of this man. For I was the king's cupbearer.
- C' (2:1-3a) And it came to pass in the month Nisan, in the twentieth year of Artaxerxes the king, that wine was before him: and I took up the wine, and gave it unto the king. Now I had not been beforetime **sad** in his presence. Wherefore the king said unto me, Why is thy countenance **sad**, seeing thou art not sick? this is nothing else but **sorrow** of heart. unto Judah, unto **the city** of my fathers' sepulchres, that I may build it. [...] (11) So I came to **Jerusalem**, and was there three days.

1:6-2:10 extended alternation

- A (1) There was a man in the land of Uz, whose name was Job; and that man was perfect and upright, and one that feared God, and eschewed evil.
- B (2) And there were born unto him seven sons and three daughters.
- C (3) His substance also was seven thousand **sheep**, and three thousand **camels**, and five hundred yoke of **oxen**, and five hundred she **asses**, and a very great household; so that this man was the greatest of all the men of the east.
- D (4-5) And his **sons** went and **feasted** in their **houses**, every one his day; and sent and called for their three **sisters** to **eat and to drink** with them. And it was so, when the days of their **feasting** were gone about, that Job sent and sanctified them, and rose up early in the morning, and offered burnt offerings according to the number of them all: for Job said, It may be that my **sons** have sinned, and cursed God in their hearts. - F (6b) and Satan came also among them.

- H (7b) Then Satan answered the LORD, and said, From going to and fro in the earth, and from walking up and down in it.
- I (8) And the LORD said unto Satan, Hast thou considered my servant Job, that there is none like him in the earth, a perfect and an upright man, one that feareth God, and escheweth evil?
- H' (9-11) Then Satan answered the LORD, and said, Doth Job fear God for nought? Hast not thou made an hedge about him, and about his house, and about all that he hath on every side? thou hast blessed the work of his hands,

and his substance is increased in the land. But put forth thine hand now, and touch all that he hath, and he will curse thee to thy face.

G' (12a) And the LORD said unto Satan, Behold, all that he hath is in thy power; only upon himself put not forth thine hand.

F' (12b) So Satan went forth

E' (12c) from the presence of the LORD.

D' (13) And there was a day when his **sons** and his **daughters** were **eating** and **drinking** wine in their eldest brother's **house**:

C' (14-17) And there came a messenger unto Job, and said, The **oxen** were plowing, and the **asses** feeding beside them: And the Sabeans fell upon them, and took them away; yea, they have slain the servants with the edge of the sword; and I only am escaped alone to tell thee. While he was yet speaking, there came also another, and said, The fire of God is fallen from heaven, and hath burned up the **sheep**, and the servants, and consumed them; and I only am escaped alone to tell thee. While he was yet speaking, there came also another, and said, The Chaldeans made out three bands, and fell upon the **camels**, and have carried them away, yea, and slain the servants with the edge of the sword; and I only am escaped alone to tell thee.

B' (18-19) While he was yet speaking, there came also another, and said, Thy sons and thy daughters were eating and drinking wine in their eldest brother's house: And, behold, there came a great wind from the wilderness, and smote the four corners of the house, and it fell upon the young men, and they are dead; and I only am escaped alone to tell thee.

A' (20-22) Then Job arose, and rent his mantle, and shaved his head, and fell down upon the ground, and worshipped, And said, Naked came I out of my mother's womb, and naked shall I return thither: the LORD gave, and the LORD hath taken away; blessed be the name of the LORD. In all this Job sinned not, nor charged God foolishly.

D' (18c) according to that which was spoken, So shall thy seed be.

C' (19-21) And being not weak in **faith**, he considered not his own body now dead, when he was about an hundred years old, neither yet the deadness of Sara's womb: He staggered not at the promise of God through unbelief; but was strong in **faith**, giving glory to God; And being fully persuaded that, what he had **promised**, he was able also to perform.

B' (22-24a) And therefore it was **imputed** to him for **righteousness**. Now it was not written for his sake alone, that it was **imputed** to him; But for us also, to whom it shall be **imputed**,

A. 10:1 For the **law** having a shadow of good things to come, and not the very image of the things, can never with those **sacrifices** which they **offered** year by year continually make the comers thereunto **perfect**. 2 For then would they not have ceased to be **offered?** because that the worshippers once purged should have had no more conscience of **sins**. 3 But in those sacrifices there is a **remembrance again made of sins every year**.

B. 4 For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and of goats should take away sins.

C. 5 Wherefore when he cometh into the world, he saith, Sacrifice and offering thou wouldest not, but a body hast thou prepared

me: 6 In burnt offerings and sacrifices for sin thou hast had no pleasure.

A'. 12 But this man, after he had **offered one sacrifice** for sins for ever, sat down on the right hand of God; 13 From henceforth expecting till his enemies be made his footstool. 14 For by **one offering** he hath **perfected** for ever them that are sanctified. 15 Whereof the Holy Ghost also is a witness to us: for after that he had said before, 16 This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, saith the Lord, I will put my **laws** into their hearts, and in their minds will I write them; 17 And their **sins** and **iniquities will I remember no more.** 18 Now where remission of these is, there is no more offering for sin.

### 2 Peter 2:1-16

#### 2:1-22 - extended alternation

A - 1 But there were **false prophets** also among the people, even as there shall be false teachers among you, who privily shall bring in damnable heresies, even denying the Lord that bought them, and bring upon themselves swift destruction. 2 And many shall follow their pernicious ways; by reason of whom the way of truth shall be evil spoken of. 3 And through **covetousness** shall they with feigned words **make merchandise of you**: whose judgment now of a long time lingereth not, and their damnation slumbereth not.

- B 4 For if God spared not the angels that sinned, but cast them down to hell, and delivered them into chains of darkness, to be reserved unto judgment;
- C 5 And **spared not the old world**, but saved Noah the eighth person, a preacher of righteousness, **bringing in the flood upon the world of the ungodly**;
- D 6 And turning the cities of **Sodom and Gomorrha** into ashes condemned them with an overthrow, making them an ensample unto those that after should live ungodly;
- E 7 And delivered **just** Lot, vexed with the filthy conversation of the wicked: 8 (For that **righteous** man dwelling among them, in seeing and hearing, vexed his **righteous** soul from day to day with their unlawful deeds;)
- F 9 The Lord knoweth how to deliver the godly out of temptations,
- E' and to reserve the **unjust** unto the day of judgment to be punished:
- D' 10 But chiefly them that walk after the flesh in the lust of uncleanness, and despise government. Presumptuous are they, selfwilled, they are not afraid to speak evil of dignities.11 Whereas angels, which are greater in power and might, bring not railing accusation against them before the Lord.
- C 12 But these, as **natural brute beasts**, made to be **taken and destroyed**, speak evil of the things that they understand not; **and shall utterly perish in their own corruption**;
- B 13 And **shall receive the reward of unrighteousness**, as they that count it pleasure to riot in the day time. Spots they are and blemishes, sporting themselves with their own deceivings while they feast with you;
- A 14 Having eyes full of adultery, and that cannot cease from sin; beguiling unstable souls: an heart they have exercised with **covetous** practices; cursed children: 15 Which have forsaken the right way, and are gone astray, following **the way of Balaam the son of Bosor**, **who loved the wages of unrighteousness**; 16 But was rebuked for his iniquity: the dumb ass speaking with man's voice forbad the madness of the **prophet**.
