Book of Daniel

Main theme – The Kingdom of God triumphing over the kingdom of men

Sub themes

1. God's protection of His children

2. God's judgements on kings and kingdoms

Chapter 1-6

- Simple stories that demonstrate God's protection of His children while judging kings and kingdoms
- (Most well-known parts of scripture)
- Pronoun is "he"
- First chapter written in Hebrew, the next 5 are in Chaldean
- Daniel explaining visions
- Kings are troubled, distressed and can't sleep

Chapter 7-12

- Detailed prophecies that demonstrate God's protection of His children while judging kings and kingdoms
- (Least well-known parts of scripture)
- Pronoun is "Ï"
- First chapter written in Chaldean, the next 5 are in Hebrew
- Gabriel explaining visions
- Daniel is troubled, distress and can't sleep



Chapter 1-5

Ch1 – Beginning of Babylon

 Vessels of God's house came into house of Neb's god. (Symbolises God's people going into captivity)

Ch2 – Near beginning Of Neb's reign

- A dream of a great statue
- 'God of heaven has given thee a kingdom' (v37)
- 'Beasts of the field and fowl of the heaven hath he given into thine hand' (v38)

Ch3 – Neb speaks against God ... "who is thy God" and throws the 3 friends into the fiery furnace. Neb's gods verses the 3 friends God Which God is in control?

Ch4 – Near end of Neb's reign

- A vision of a great tree
- 'Till thou know the Most High rules in the kingdom of men and gives it to whomsoever He will' (v25)
- 'Beasts of the field had shadow under it and the fowls of heaven dwelt in the boughs' (v12)

Ch5 – End of Babylon

 Vessels of God's house brought out from house of Neb's god (Symbolises God's people getting ready to come out of captivity)

Structure of the Book of Daniel

The Whole book divided into 3

Chapter 6-9

Ch6 – 1st year of Darius

- Daniel prays (v10)
- Toward Jerusalem (v10)
- Princes come while he's praying (v11)
- Princes are cut off (wives and children) (v24)

Ch7 – 1st year of Belshazzar

- 4 beasts from the sea (the last has 10 horns out of which comes a little horn that subdues 3 of the horns)
- 4th beast stamps with his feet (v7,23)
- Little horn of the beast makes war with saints and speaks words against the Most High...until the judgement sits. (Western Roman empire)

Ch8 – 3rd year of Belshazzar

- 2 beasts by a river (the last has 1 horn which is broken and 4 replace it and out of one comes a little horn)
- Goat stamps with his feet (v7)
- Little horn of the goat causes the host and sanctuary to be cast under foot and magnifies himself in his heart...until he is broken.
- (Eastern Roman empire)

Ch9 – 1st year of Darius

- Daniel prays (v3)
- 70 yrs of Jerusalem's desolations accomplished (v2)
- Gabriel comes while he was speaking in prayer (v21)
- Messiah the Prince shall be cut off (v25-26)

Chapter 10-12

Ch10 – 3rd year of Cyrus

- Time appointed was long (v1)
- Daniel understood the vision (v1)
- Certain man clothed in linen (v5-6)
- Symbolic resurrection of Daniel (v8-19)
- None that holdeth... but Michael your prince (v21)

Ch11 – Goes back to 1st year of Darius

- Conflict between the King of the North and the King of the South.
- King of the North shall be against the holy covenant causing many to fall by sword, flame, captivity and spoil...he shall exalt himself and magnify himself above all and speak marvellous things against the God of gods...until divine indignation be accomplished (North and South Grecian Kingdoms)

Ch12 – 3rd year of Cyrus

- Michael...the great Prince which standeth for the children of *thy people* (v1)
- Resurrection of *many* (v2)
- Man clothed in linen with two others (5-7)
- Daniel understood not (v8)
- The time appointed is 1290yrs (and 1335) **(v11-12)**

Note the singular in Ch10 and the plural in Ch12 (i.e. 'your prince' 10v2 and 'prince of your people' 12v1)

(INDIVIDUAL CHAPTERS)

Daniel Chapter 2

- A Neb has a dream he doesn't understand, which troubles him (V1)
 - B Wise men cannot interpret (V2-13)
 - 1. Tell me the dream and interpretation
 - 2. No man can only the gods
 - C Daniel asks Arioch why the hasty decree to slay all the wise men (V14-16) (Decree goes out from the king in haste)
 - D Daniel and 3 friends pray for mercies concerning the secret (V17-18)
 - E The secret is revealed to Daniel (a phrase that occurs 6 more times in the 2nd half (V22,28,29,30,47 twice) (V19)
 - D Daniel prays with thankfulness for the revealing of the secret (V19-23)
 - C Daniel asks Arioch not to destroy all the wise men (24-25)
 (Daniel is brought in to the king in haste)
 - B Daniel is able to interpret (V27-45)
 - 2. Daniel says 'I can't only the God of heaven can
 - 1. Tells the dream and the interpretation
- A Neb now understands the dream and is thankful to Daniel (46-49)

Layer 5

(SECTIONS WITHIN A CHAPTER)

The Dream (2v31-35)

- A Behold a great image...whose brightness was excellent (V31)
 - B stood before thee (V31)
 - C and the form thereof was terrible (V31)
 - D This images head was of fine gold, his breast and arms of silver, his belly and thighs of brass, his legs of iron, his feet part of iron and part of clay. (V32-33)
 - E till a stone was cut out without hands which smote the image upon the feet of iron and clay and brake them to pieces (V34)
 - D Then was the iron, the clay, the brass, the silver, and the gold (V5)
 - C Broken to pieces together and became like chaff (V35) (i.e. no longer had any form)
 - B The wind carried them away so that no place was found for them (V35) (i.e. no longer able to stand)
- A The stone...became a great mountain and filled the whole earth (V35)

The Interpretation (2v37-44)

- A a) God of heaven hath given thee a kingdom (V37)
 - b) After thee shall arise another kingdom...and another third kingdom...And the fourth kingdom (V39,40)
 - c) Shall it break in pieces and bruise (V40)
 - B a) Whereas thou sawest the feet and toes, part of iron and part of clay, the kingdom shall be divided
 - b) But there shall be in it the strength of the iron, forasmuch as thou sawest iron mixed with miry clay. (V41)
 - C The toes of the feet were part of iron and part of clay so the kingdom shall be partly strong and partly broken (V42)
 - B a) Whereas thou sawest iron mixed with miry clay, they shall mingle themselves with the seed of men b) But they shall not cleave one to another, even as iron is not mixed with clay. (V43)
- A a) God of heaven shall set up a kingdom (V44)
 - b) Which shall never be destroyed. It shall not be left to other people (V44)
 - c) Shall brake in pieces and consume (V44)
