PHILEMON

- A. 1 Paul, a prisoner of **Jesus Christ**, and Timothy our brother, unto Philemon our dearly beloved, and **fellowlabourer**, 2 And to our beloved Apphia, and Archippus our **fellowsoldier**, and to the church in thy house: 3 **Grace** to you, and peace, from God our Father and the **Lord Jesus Christ**.
- B. a. 4 I thank my God, making mention of thee always in my **prayers**, 5 Hearing of thy **love** and **faith**, which thou hast toward the Lord Jesus, and toward all **saints**;
 - b. 6 That the communication of thy <u>faith</u> may become effectual by the acknowledging of every good thing which is in you in Christ Jesus.
 - c. 7 For we have great joy and consolation in thy <u>love</u>, because the <u>bowels</u> of the <u>saints</u> are <u>refreshed</u> by thee,
 - d. brother.
- C. a. 8 Wherefore, though I might be much bold in Christ to enjoin thee that which is convenient, 9 Yet for love's sake I rather beseech thee, being such an one as **Paul** the aged, and now also a prisoner of Jesus Christ.
 - b. 10 I beseech thee for my son **Onesimus**, whom I have begotten in my bonds:
 - c. 11 Which in time past was to thee unprofitable, *but now* profitable to **thee** and to **me**: 12 Whom I have sent again: thou therefore **receive him**, that is, mine own bowels:
 - d. 13 Whom I would have **retained** (*katecho*) with me, that in thy stead he might have ministered unto me in the bonds of the gospel:
- D. 14 But without thy mind would I do nothing; that thy benefit should not be as it were of necessity, but willingly.
- C'. d'. 15 For perhaps he therefore departed for a season, that thou shouldest receive (apacho) him for ever;
 - c'. 16 *Not now* as a servant, but above a servant, a brother beloved, specially to **me**, but how much more unto **thee**, both in the flesh, and in the Lord? 17 If thou count me therefore a partner, **receive him** as myself.
 - b'. 18 If **he** hath wronged thee, or oweth thee ought, put that on mine account;
- a'. 19 I Paul have written it with mine own hand, I will repay it: albeit I do not say to thee how thou owest unto me even thine own self besides.
- B'. d'. 20 Yea, brother, let me have joy of thee in the Lord:
 - c'. refresh my bowels in the Lord.
 - b'. 21 Having confidence in thy obedience I wrote unto thee, knowing that **thou wilt also do** more than I say.
- a'. 22 But withal prepare me also a lodging: for I trust that through your **prayers** I shall be given unto you.
- A'. 23 There salute thee Epaphras, my **fellow**prisoner in **Christ Jesus**; 24 Marcus, Aristarchus, Demas, Lucas, my **fellowlabourers**. 25 The **grace** of our **Lord Jesus Christ** be with your spirit. Amen.
