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1 Timothy

1:1 Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the commandment of God our Saviour, and Lord Jesus Christ, which is our hope; 2 Unto **Timothy**, my own **son** in the faith: Grace, mercy, and peace, from God our Father and Jesus Christ our Lord.

A. The Charge to Deal with false teachers.

a. 3 As I besought thee to abide still at Ephesus, when I went into Macedonia, that thou mightest **charge** some that they **teach no other doctrine**, **4 Neither give heed to fables and endless genealogies**, which minister questions, rather than godly edifying which is in faith: so do. 5 Now the end of the **commandment** is charity out of a pure heart, and of a **good conscience**, and of **faith** unfeigned: 6 **From which some having swerved** have turned aside unto vain jangling; 7 Desiring to be teachers of the law; understanding neither what they say, nor whereof they affirm.

b. sinners

- i. 8 But we know that the law is good, if a man use it lawfully;
- ii. 9 Knowing this, that the law is not made for a righteous man,
- ii'. but for the lawless and disobedient, for the ungodly and for **sinners**, for unholy and profane, for murderers of fathers and murderers of mothers, for manslayers, 10 For whoremongers, for them that defile themselves with mankind, for menstealers, for liars, for perjured persons,
- i'. and if there be any other thing that is contrary to sound **doctrine**; 11 According to the glorious gospel of the blessed God, which was committed to my trust (*pistueo*).

b'. saving sinners

i. 12 And I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who hath enabled me, for that he counted me faithful (*pistos*), putting me into the ministry;

- ii. 13 Who was before a **blasphemer**, and a persecutor, and injurious: but I obtained mercy, because I did it ignorantly in **unbelief**. 14 And the grace of our Lord was exceeding abundant with faith and love which is in Christ Jesus. iii. 15 This is a faithful saying, and worthy of all acceptation, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners:
- ii'. of whom I am chief. 16 Howbeit for this cause I obtained mercy, that in me first Jesus Christ might shew forth all longsuffering, for a pattern to them which should hereafter **believe** on him to life everlasting.
- i'. 17 Now unto the King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only wise God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.
- a'. 18 This **charge** I commit unto thee, **son Timothy**, according to the prophecies which went before on thee, that thou by them mightest war a good warfare; 19 Holding **faith**, and a **good conscience**; **which some having put away** concerning **faith** have **made shipwreck**: 20 Of whom is Hymenaeus and Alexander; whom I have delivered unto Satan, that they may learn not to **blaspheme**.

B. Exhortation and instruction

Prayer

- a. 2:1 I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, **prayers**, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; 2 For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty.
- b. 3 For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour; 4 Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the **truth**.
- c. 5 For there is one God,
- d. and one mediator between God and men,
- c'. the man Christ Jesus;
- b'. 6 Who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time. 7 Whereunto I am ordained a preacher, and an apostle, (I speak the **truth** in Christ, and lie not;) a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and **verity** (truth).
- a'. 8 I will therefore that men **pray** every where, lifting up holy hands, without wrath and doubting.

the place of women

- a. 9 In like manner also, that **women** adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and **sobriety**; not with broided hair, or gold, or pearls, or costly array; 10 But (which becometh **women** professing godliness) with good works.
- b. 11 Let the woman learn in silence with all subjection.
- c. 12 But I suffer not a woman to teach, nor to usurp authority over the man,
- b' but to be in silence.
- a'.13 For Adam was first formed, then Eve. 14 And Adam was not deceived, but the woman being deceived was in the transgression. 15 Notwithstanding she shall be saved in childbearing, if they continue in faith and charity and holiness with sobriety.

Bishops and deacons

a. 3:1 This is a true saying, If a man desire **the office** of a bishop, he desireth a good work.

b. 2 A bishop then must be blameless, the husband of one wife, vigilant, sober, of good behaviour, given to hospitality, apt to teach; 3 Not given to wine, no striker, not greedy of filthy lucre; but patient, not a brawler, not covetous;

- 4 One that ruleth well his own house, having **his children** in subjection with all gravity; 5 For if a man **know not how to rule his own house**, how shall he take care of the church of God?
- c. 6 Not a novice, lest being lifted up with pride he **fall into** the condemnation of the **devil**.

c'. 7 Moreover he must have a good report of them which are without; lest he **fall into** reproach and the snare of the **devil**.

b'. 8 Likewise must the **deacons** be grave, not doubletongued, not given to much wine, not greedy of filthy lucre;

9 Holding the mystery of the faith in a pure conscience.

10 And let these also first be proved; then let them use the office of a **deacon**,

being found blameless.

11 Even so must their wives be grave, not slanderers, sober, faithful in all things.

12 Let the deacons be the husbands of one wife, ruling their children and their own houses well.

a'.13 For they that have used **the office** of a deacon well purchase to themselves **a good degree**, and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus.

C. The ecclesia ground of truth

14 These things write I unto thee, hoping to come unto thee shortly: 15 But if I tarry long, that thou mayest know how thou oughtest to behave thyself in the house of God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth.

16 And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness:

- i. God was manifest in the flesh,
- ii. justified in the Spirit,
- iii. seen of angels,
- iii'. preached unto the Gentiles,
- ii'. believed on in the world,
- i'. received up into glory.

A'. The Charge to Deal with false teachers

- a. 4:1 Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the **faith**, **giving heed to** seducing spirits, and **doctrines** of devils; 2 Speaking lies in hypocrisy; having their conscience seared with a hot iron; 3 Forbidding to marry, *and commanding* to abstain from meats, which God hath created to be received with thanksgiving of **them which believe** and know the truth. 4 For every creature of God *is* good, and nothing to be refused, if it be received with thanksgiving: 5 For it is sanctified by the word of God and prayer.
- b. 6 If thou put the brethren in remembrance of **these things**, thou shalt be a good minister of Jesus Christ, nourished up in the words of **faith** and of good **doctrine**, whereunto thou hast attained.7 But refuse profane and old wives' fables, and exercise thyself *rather* unto godliness. 8 For bodily exercise profiteth little: but godliness is profitable unto all things, having promise of the life that now is, and of that which is to come.
- a'. 9 This *is* a **faithful** saying and worthy of all acceptation. 10 For therefore we both labour and suffer reproach, because we trust in the living God, who is the Saviour of all men, specially of **those that believe**.
- b'. 11 **These things <u>command</u>** and teach. 12 Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an example of **the believers**, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in **faith**, in purity. 13 Till I come, **give attendance to** reading, to exhortation, to **doctrine**. 14 Neglect not the gift that is in thee, which was given thee by prophecy, with the laying on of the hands of the presbytery. 15 Meditate upon **these things**; give thyself wholly to them; that thy profiting may appear to all. 16 Take heed unto thyself, and unto the **doctrine**; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee.

B'. Exhortation and instruction

- a. relationships in the ecclesia
- 5:1. Rebuke not **an elder**, but intreat *him* as a father; and the younger men as brethren; 2 The **elder** women as mothers; the younger as sisters, with all purity.

b. Widows

i. 3 Honour widows that are widows indeed. 4 But if any widow have children or nephews, let them learn first to shew piety at home, and to requite their parents: for that is good and acceptable before God. 5 Now she that is a widow indeed, and desolate, trusteth in God, and continueth in

supplications and prayers night and day. 6 But **she** that liveth in pleasure is dead while **she** liveth. 7 And these things give in **charge**, that they may be blameless. 8 But if any provide not for his own, and specially for those of **his own house**, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel.

- ii. 9 Let not a **widow** be taken into the number under threescore years old, having been the wife of one man,
- 10 Well reported of for good works; if she have brought up children, if she have lodged strangers, if she have washed the saints' feet, if she have relieved the afflicted, if she have diligently followed every good work.
- ii'. 11 But the younger **widows** refuse: for when they have begun to wax wanton against Christ, they will marry; 12 Having damnation, because they have cast off their first faith. 13 And withal they learn *to be* idle, wandering about from house to house; and not only idle, but tattlers also and busybodies, speaking things which they ought not.
- i'.14 I will therefore that the younger women marry, bear children, guide **the house**, give none occasion to the adversary to speak reproachfully. 15 For some are already turned aside after Satan. 16 If any man or woman that believeth have **widows**, let them relieve them, and let not the church be charged; that it may relieve them that are widows indeed.

c. Elders

17 Let **the elders** that rule well be counted worthy of double honour, especially they who labour in the word and doctrine. 18 For the scripture saith, Thou shalt not muzzle the ox that treadeth out the corn. And, The labourer *is* worthy of his reward. 19 Against an **elder** receive not an accusation, but before two or three witnesses. 20 Them that sin rebuke before all, that others also may fear.

d. For Timothy personally

21 I <u>charge</u> thee before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, and the elect angels, that thou observe these things without preferring one before another, doing nothing by partiality. 22 Lay hands suddenly on no man, neither be partaker of other men's sins: keep thyself pure. 23 Drink no longer water, but use a little wine for thy stomach's sake and thine often infirmities.24 Some men's sins are open beforehand, going before to judgment; and some *men* they follow after. 25 Likewise also the good works *of some* are manifest beforehand; and they that are otherwise cannot be hid.

e. servants

6:1 Let as many servants as are under the yoke count their own masters worthy of all honour, that the name of God and *his* doctrine be not blasphemed. 2 And they that have believing masters, let them not despise

them, because they are brethren; but rather do *them* service, because they are faithful and beloved, partakers of the benefit.

A". Dealing with false teachers

- a. These things teach and exhort. 3 If any **man teach** otherwise, and consent not to wholesome words, even the words of our Lord Jesus Christ, and to the doctrine which is according to **godliness**;
- b. 4 He is proud, **knowing nothing**, but **doting** about questions and **strifes of words**,
- c. whereof cometh envy, strife, railings, evil surmisings,
- b'. 5 **Perverse disputings** of men of **corrupt minds**, and **destitute of the truth**, supposing that gain is **godliness**:
- a'. from **such** withdraw thyself.

B". Exhortation and instruction

- a. 6 But godliness with contentment is great gain. 7 For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. 8 And having food and raiment let us be therewith content. 9 **But they that will be rich** fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction and perdition. 10 For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows.
- b. 11 But **thou**, O man of God, flee these things; and follow after righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, meekness. 12 Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and hast **professed a good profession** before many **witnesses**.
- b'. 13 I give thee <u>charge</u> in the sight of God, who quickeneth all things, and before Christ Jesus, who before Pontius Pilate <u>witnessed a good confession</u>; 14 That thou keep this commandment without spot, unrebukeable, until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ: 15 Which in his times he shall shew, who is the blessed and only Potentate, the King

of kings, and Lord of lords; Who only hath immortality, 16 dwelling in the light which no man can approach unto; whom no man hath seen, nor can see: to whom be honour and power everlasting. Amen.

a'. 17 <u>Charge</u> them that are <u>rich</u> in this world, that they be not highminded nor trust in uncertain <u>riches</u> but in the living God, who giveth us richly all things to enjoy; 18 That they do good, <u>that they be rich</u> in good works, ready to distribute, willing to communicate; 19 Laying up in store for themselves a good foundation against the time to come, that they may lay hold on eternal life.
