## 2 TIMOTHY

- A'. Visit Paul in prison who is about to be executed 4:9-21
- 1:1 Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ by the will of God, according to the promise of life which is in Christ Jesus, 2 To Timothy, my dearly beloved son: Grace, mercy, and peace, from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.
- A. Don't be ashamed of the gospel or Paul 1:1-18
- A . Paul's desire to see Timothy
- a. 3 I thank God, whom I serve from my forefathers
- b. with pure conscience,
- c. that without ceasing I have **remembrance** of thee in my prayers night and day;
- d. 4 Greatly desiring to see thee, being mindful of thy tears, that I may be filled with joy;
- c.' 5 When I call to remembrance
- b'. the unfeigned faith
- a'. that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy **grandmother** Lois, and thy **mother** Eunice; and I am persuaded that in thee also.
- B. Do not be ashamed
- a. 6 Wherefore I put thee in remembrance that thou stir up the gift of God, which is in thee by the putting on of my hands.

- b. 7 For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.
- c. 8 Be not thou therefore **ashamed** of the testimony of our Lord, nor of me his prisoner:
- d. but be thou partaker of the **afflictions** of the gospel according to the power of God;
- e. 9 Who hath saved us, and called us with an holy calling,
- f. not according to our works, but according to his own purpose and grace, which was given us in Christ Jesus before the world began,
- e'.10 But is now made manifest by the appearing of our Saviour Jesus Christ, who hath abolished death, and hath brought life and immortality to light through the gospel:
- d'. 11 Whereunto I am appointed a preacher, and an apostle, and a teacher of the Gentiles.12 For the which cause I also suffer these things:
- c'. nevertheless I am not **ashamed**: for I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day.
- b'.13 Hold fast the form of **sound** words, which thou hast heard of me, in faith and **love** which is in Christ Jesus.
- a'.14 That good thing which was committed unto thee keep by the **Holy Ghost which dwelleth in us.**
- A'. Onesiphorus was not ashamed
- a.15 This thou knowest,
- b. that all they which are in **Asia** be turned away from me; of whom are Phygellus and Hermogenes.
- c.16 The Lord give mercy unto the house of Onesiphorus;
- d. for he oft refreshed me, and was not ashamed of my chain: 17 But, when he was in Rome, he sought me out very diligently, and found me.

- c'.18 The Lord grant unto him that **he may find mercy of the Lord** in that day:
- b'. and in how many things he ministered unto me at **Ephesus**,
- a'. thou knowest very well.
- B. Endure hardship
- a. 2:1 Thou therefore, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus. 2 And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, **the same** commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also.
- b. 3 Thou therefore **endure hardness (kakopatheo)**, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ.
- i. 4 No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier.
- ii. 5 And if a man also strive for masteries, yet is he not crowned, except he strive lawfully.
- iii. 6 The husbandman that laboureth must be first partaker of the fruits.
- c. 7 Consider what I say; and the Lord give thee understanding in all things.
- b'. 8 Remember that Jesus Christ of the seed of David was raised from the dead according to my gospel: 9 Wherein I suffer trouble (kakopatheo), as an evil doer, even unto bonds; but the word of God is not bound.10 Therefore I endure all things for the elect's sakes, that they may also obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory. 11 It is a faithful saying: For if we be dead with him, we shall also live with him: 12 If we suffer, we shall also reign with him: if we deny him, he also will deny us: 13 If we believe not, yet he abideth faithful: he cannot deny himself.
- a'. 14 **Of these things put them in remembrance, charging them** before the Lord that they strive not about words to no profit, but to the subverting of the hearers.
- C. Focus on sound exposition of scripture 2:15-26

- a. 15 Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing **the word of truth.**
- b. 16 **But shun profane and vain babblings**: for they will increase unto more ungodliness. 17 And their word will eat as doth a canker: of whom is Hymenaeus and Philetus; 18 Who concerning the truth have erred, saying that the resurrection is past already; and overthrow the faith of some.
- c. 19 Nevertheless the foundation of God standeth sure, having this seal, **The Lord** knoweth them that are his. And, Let every one that nameth the name of Christ **depart from iniquity.**
- d. 20 But in a great house there are not only **vessels** of gold and of silver, but also of wood and of earth; and some **to honour**, and some to dishonour.
- d'. 21 If a man therefore purge himself from these, he shall be a **vessel unto honour**, sanctified, and meet for the master's use, and prepared unto every good work.
- c'. 22 Flee also youthful lusts: but follow righteousness, faith, charity, peace, with them that call on the Lord out of a pure heart.
- b'. 23 But **foolish and unlearned questions avoid**, knowing that they do gender strifes.
- a'. 24 And the servant of the Lord must not strive; but be gentle unto all men, apt to teach, patient, 25 In meekness instructing those that oppose themselves; if God peradventure will give them repentance to the acknowledging of **the truth**; 26 And that they may recover themselves out of the snare of the devil, who are taken who are taken captive by him at his will.

## D. False teachers will arise 3:1-9

a. 3:1 **This know also**, that in the last days perilous times shall come. 2 For men shall be **lovers** of their own selves, covetous (**lovers** of silver), boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, 3 Without natural affection, trucebreakers, false accusers, incontinent, fierce, despisers of those that are good, 4 Traitors, heady, highminded, **lovers** of pleasures more than **lovers** of God; 5 Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away.

- b. 6 For of this sort are they which creep into houses, and lead captive silly women laden with sins, led away with divers lusts, 7 Ever learning, and never able to come to the knowledge of **the truth**.
- b'. 8 Now as Jannes and Jambres withstood Moses, so do these also resist **the truth**: men of corrupt minds, reprobate concerning the faith.
- a'. 9 But they shall proceed no further: for **their folly shall be manifest unto all men**, as theirs also was.
- B'. Paul endured and was delivered 3:10-12
- a. 10 But thou hast fully known my doctrine, manner of life, purpose, faith, longsuffering, charity, patience, 11 **Persecutions**, afflictions, which came unto me at Antioch, at Iconium, at Lystra;
- b. what **persecutions** I endured:
- b', but out of them all the Lord delivered me.
- a'. 12 Yea, and all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution.
- C'. Focus on sound exposition of scripture 3:13-17
- a. 13 But evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse, deceiving, and being deceived.14 But continue **thou** in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned them;
- b. 15 And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.
- c. 16 All scripture is given by inspiration of God,
- b'. and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:
- a'. 17 That **the man of God** may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works.
- D'. False teachers will arise 4:1-8

- a. 4:1 I **charge** thee therefore before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, who shall judge the quick and the dead at **his appearing** and his kingdom;
- b. 2 Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine.
- C. 3 For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears;
- C'. 4 And they shall turn away their **ears** from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables.
- B'. 5 But watch thou in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, make full proof of thy ministry.
- A'. 6 For I am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure is at hand. 7 I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: 8 Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing.
- A'. Visit Paul in prison who is about to be executed 4:9-21
- a. 9 Do thy diligence to come shortly unto me:
- b. [*Paul's co-workers*] 10 For Demas hath forsaken me, having loved this present world, and is departed unto Thessalonica; Crescens to Galatia, Titus unto Dalmatia. 11 Only Luke is with me. Take Mark, and bring him with thee: for he is profitable to me for the ministry. 12 And Tychicus have I sent to Ephesus. 13 The cloke that I left at Troas with Carpus, when thou comest, bring with thee, and the books, but especially the parchments.
- c. 14 Alexander the coppersmith did me much evil (kakos): the Lord reward him according to his **works**:15 Of whom be thou ware also; for he hath greatly withstood our words.
- d. 16 At my first answer **no man stood with me**, but all men forsook me: I pray God that it may not be laid to their charge.

- d'. 17 Notwithstanding **the Lord stood with me**, and strengthened me; that by me the preaching might be fully known, and that all the Gentiles might hear; and I was delivered out of the mouth of the lion.
- c'. 18 And the Lord shall deliver me from every evil (poneros) **work**, and will preserve me unto his heavenly kingdom: to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen.
- b'. 19 [*Paul's co-workers*] Salute Prisca and Aquila, and the household of Onesiphorus. 20 Erastus abode at Corinth: but Trophimus have I left at Miletum sick.
- a'. 21 **Do thy diligence to come** before winter. Eubulus greeteth thee, and Pudens, and Linus, and Claudia, and all the brethren.
- 22 The Lord Jesus Christ be with thy spirit. Grace be with you. Amen.
